# Parent Update - June 2023

#### **New Timetable**

On Monday 5 June we welcomed back all returning students at the start of our new timetable for Session 2023-24. I would like to note my thanks to Mr Dewar, our timetabler, for his work on the timetable and Mrs Razavi in the office for her administrative support. It is a large undertaking to build a timetable that is flexible and meets the needs of the highest percentage of pupils possible. Over the next few weeks we will deal with omissions and other admin errors on student timetables. No students will be permitted to change courses until August when exam results are confirmed.

In line with our current SQA Presentation policy which encompasses coursing and re-coursing protocols, we are paying more attention to relevant course changes and are requiring young people to build more class time before making decisions as well as looking at the overall three year picture and likely destinations. Students will not just be able to drop courses to take up study periods without very good cause as there is evidence this does not support better outcomes and actually may limit choices going forward. Generally, we feel that many of our young people can cope with more academically and lack confidence and resilience. We are trying to improve outcomes and destinations across the board, hand in hand with an improved range of courses that offer progression.

#### **New School Start Time**

There is no longer a registration period at the start of the day. <u>The school doors are open from 8.35am to</u> allow students to enter and be in class on time.

- Students arriving after 8.40am to their period 1 class will be recorded as being late for school.
- Students arriving after 8.40am who have to enter at the main student entrance will be recorded by the school office.
- Continual and unexplained absence will attract a time back sanction. Continued offending will result in us communicating home to parents to seek improvement.

#### **Exam Diet**

We had a very smooth SQA exam diet and we note out thanks to members of the school and wider community who assisted with invigilation and SQA additional arrangements. **Results will be available to young people on 8 August** and they have received reminders about signing up for SQA text alerts today in school.

## **Staffing News:**

There have been a number of staff movements in the last few months and some new staff will be joining us at the start of next session.

Mrs Diane Razavi will leave her role as Administration Manger in August after over 22 years of outstanding service. Over her time here she has supported a multitude of staff in their working lives and a huge number of young people on their school journey. She is a very able person who shows great loyalty and commitment to her job and she has a wonderful institutional memory that has helped the smooth operation of the school over many years. Diane will be hard to replace and we will miss her but we respect her decision to make a new start and wish her all the best in her new role.

## **Uniform into next session**

It is pleasing to see so many young people in good uniform at the start of the new timetable. There are some minor issues with non-black hoodies or jerseys. We realise that many young people grow quite a bit over summer. We have therefore asked that if there are issues prior to summer that parent/carers write to confirm that an exception to wearing uniform is required until August. At the start of session we would respectfully request all young people are in correct uniform.

## The uniform is as follows:

White shirt or blouse
Black V neck jumper or cardigan (top must be black)
School tie
Black trousers or skirt
Black shoes

School Blazer - if purchased

Ripped/torn jeans and skirts **are not permitted as normal uniform**. Outdoor clothing must be removed in all classes.

**PLEASE NOTE:** In the past ties have been free but unfortunately rising costs and budget cuts have forced us to recover some of the supply cost. **This year school ties; junior blue and white striped and senior – black with crest, will therefore cost £5 and are available now from the school <b>office**. This charge also applies to incoming S1 students in August. <u>Any student who is entitled to free school meals will receive a tie free of charge</u>.

Non-uniform clothing, worn temporarily must be of an appropriate standard. This is also the case for non-uniform days where there should be no offensive logos on clothing, football strips or beach wear. We are planning a formal uniform consultation with young people and parent/carers on our return in August and that will help inform our uniform policy moving forward.

The Parent Council on behalf of the Parent Forum has formally agreed our uniform policy. If we feel the uniform is not appropriate to the school setting we will write or phone to ask for your support to address the situation.

#### **School Blazers**

Our smart Uniform blazers are available for all students. A full range of sizes are available at the following cost of:

The blazers are hard wearing, machine washable and made from recycled plastic bottles so are environmentally friendly as well.
