PRAISE postcards will also be awarded throughout the year as recognition of achievements. **10 points** will be awarded per postcard under their corresponding categories.

PRIDE points are the updated House points system. The points are as follows:

- **Participation**: 20 points for participating in House events.
- **<u>Respect</u>**: 30 points awarded by teachers throughout the year for exceptional acts and successes.
- Inclusion: 30 points for each club you attend (this will be reviewed termly).
- <u>Determination</u>: 20 Points to all pupils with 100% attendance each term. Doesn't include authorised absences and off sicks.
- **Excellence**: Up to 100 Points for the winners of House events.
