Student Toilets – 24 October 2023

Please Note: The Green Seat toilets – male and female will remain closed this week. The social area within the green seat area is now open for S4/5 students.

I wish to apologise for this disruption which as you know is an ongoing consequences of a reckless and extremely dangerous act in a male toilet last term that resulted in a fire and evacuation. This has been followed up by the Police and Fire service.

The toilets in school belong to all students and the facilities should be treated with respect and be freely accessible to anyone who requires to use them. No one should feel unsafe or intimidated in our toilets. **I would ask that students stand up for their right to have safe and clean toilets and inform duty and or senior staff if they do not feel able to enter the toilets, experience any harassment or bullying within those spaces, find unsanitary conditions or see vandalising or dangerous behaviour – including vaping.**

Toilets will be re-designated as junior or senior toilets next week once we have most of them operational. This will be enforced and there will be closer management of toilet spaces at lunch and break times by senior staff. All toilet entrance points are now covered by CCTV and all negative behaviours will be fully investigated.

Students who continue to congregate in the toilets unnecessarily and / or are caught vaping in these areas will face disciplinary consequences and may have some rights curtailed.

REMEMBER - Please stand up for your right to have safe access to all areas of school and you can inform us of poor behaviour in confidence at any time without you being identified.

Let us all make this a good place to be.

Thank you for your support and I am happy to talk to any students about these issues at any time.

This course will be delivered by PickleBall Scotland representatives. Pickleball is a fun sport for all ages that combines elements of badminton, tennis, and table tennis. Played both indoors or outdoors on a badminton-sized court and a slightly modified tennis net. Two or four players use solid paddles made of wood or composite materials to hit a perforated polymer ball, over a net. During this training session, you will be given an introduction to the sport and how to play it, information on what equipment is needed, ideas on managing groups and fun games ideas.
