EMA

Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is a weekly payment of £30 for young people who are planning to continue in post-compulsory education from August, 2023. Eligibility:

Pupils born between 1st March, 2004 and 30th September, 2007 may be eligible for an award starting in August, 2023.

Pupils born between 1st October, 2007 and 29th February, 2008 may be eligible for an award starting in January, 2024. Pupils eligible from January, 2024 do not need to wait until January to submit their application form.

The taxable household income between April, 2022 and April, 2023 determines the award:

Income of up to £24,421 (for families with a single dependant child) - £30

Income of up to £26,884 (for families with more than one dependant child) - £30

Dependant children are all those up to the age of 16 and those over the age of 16 and up to the age of 25 if they're in full time or higher education courses.
